MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING – Minutes of Meeting held at the Mungallala Hall in on Sunday 20th September have been distributed via newsletter and taken as read.

- QHMC report – changes to SIVS that those that have SIVS registration must remain a member of a club. There is now a fine of up to \$2757 – more for heavier vehicles - for those who are using their SIVS registered vehicle outside the guidelines

BUSINESS ARISING FROM MINUTES:

- Signatures have been updated at the bank.
- Dropbox – Have discussed with Sarah I also had a chat with her about Dropbox. She recommends Dropbox over Google Drive. You need to pay for both over a certain quota, but she said that for non-professionals (like us 😊) that Dropbox is far more user friendly. She said that you can have a paid personal and a paid business one operational at the same time (which was one of my questions). A business one might be best as it carries three separate multi use licences where a paid personal one only licences over several devices. I haven't had a chance to look up costs yet, though. *This item of business differed to next meeting when further details are confirmed.*

- Magnetic Stickers – Ken gave details on received quotes.
 - Quotes given on 2 types - large and small sizes and Square or round cut and 50 or 100 quantities.
 - Large vs Small differs in a small cost difference.
 - Round cut magnets attracted an additional premium price.
 - Significant discount when purchasing 100 items over the 50.
 - Magnet material is thicker than the previous purchase magnets.
 - A vote was taken on large or small size – Large Magnets were accepted for purchase.
 - A vote was taken for square or round cut – Members were happy to purchase square cut magnets.
 - Ken Moved a motion to purchase 100 large Magnets, square cut for \$910.20 Inc GST. Seconded by Greg Seawright – Motion Carried.

- 96 affiliated clubs which gives the QHMC good lobbying strengths.
- Transport Operations (Road Use Management—Vehicle Registration) Regulation 2021
- Changes to SIVS guidelines as below

242 Use of concessionally registered special interest vehicle for which condition imposed

The registered operator of a concessionally registered special interest vehicle for which the chief executive has imposed a condition under section 230(3) must not use the vehicle, or permit the vehicle to be used, in contravention of the condition.

Maximum penalty—

- (a) if the concessionally registered special interest vehicle is a category 1 vehicle—20 penalty units; or
- (b) if the concessionally registered special interest vehicle is a category 2 vehicle—60 penalty units.

Historic vehicles—proof of eligibility

Club membership—You are required to provide evidence of current membership with an incorporated vehicle club or association to be eligible for this concession. This membership should be maintained while the vehicle is registered under the scheme.

Your club can provide evidence of your current membership, which needs to:

- be on club letterhead
- include details of your vehicle (make, model, year and chassis number)
- be signed by a club official.

Club membership for organisations must be in the name of the person responsible for the organisation (for example the proprietor/business holder or director).

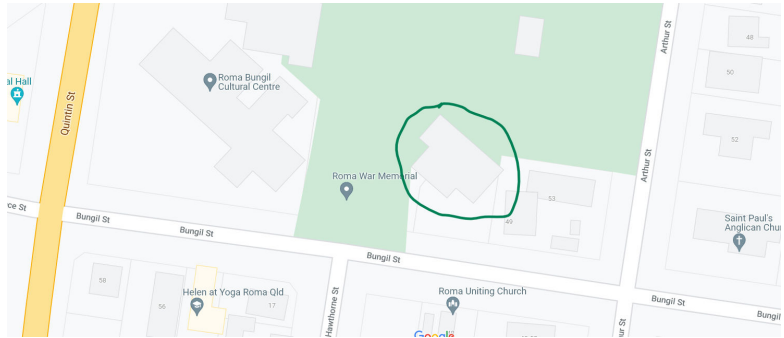
